THE NEW TESTAMENT: GENERAL

RAFAEL AGUIRRE (ED.), *De Jerusalén a Roma: La marginalidad del cristianismo de los orígenes*, Ágora 41 (Estella [Navarra]: Verbo Divino, 2021, paper €23) 264 pp., 2 maps. Bibliographies. LCN: 2020503900. ISBN: 978-84-9073-675-3.

The eight essays in this volume explore the attitude of early Christian groups toward the world in which they lived, with a focus on their minority and marginal status within both the empire and Judaism. After a seven-page introduction written jointly by all the contributors, the essays are by C. Bernabé Ubieta on the kingdom of God and its proposal as understood from the perspective of creative marginality; C. Gil Arbiol on citizenship in heaven—a marginal proposal in Philippians; E. Aldave Medrano on marginality in the Gospel of John; R. Aguirre Monasterio on the stone that was rejected (Mk 12:10-11 parr.; Acts 4:11; 1 Pet 2:7); S. Rosell Nebreda on the Apocalypse—vision of a new world; D. Álvarez Cineira on Roman Christianity according to *I Clement*; F. Rivas Rebaque on marginalization in Ignatius of Antioch; and E. Estévez López on work and money in the marginal early Christian communities. The volume concludes with a collective reflection by the authors, which contends that the marginality of early Christian communities was an essential feature in their capacity to forge alternative values and projects of social transformation, and that rediscovering early Christianity's marginal and minority status can be significant for modern Christianity, especially in Europe.
